

SUBJECT: Bureau of Immunization Assessments Ranked by County for
Fiscal Year 1999/2000

INFORMATION ONLY

For your review and information, the attached results of major Bureau of Immunization assessments have been ranked according to performance by county. Individual analyses on these assessments have previously been sent to you. The high-risk infants data are cumulative data of reports on infants born October 1998 through September 1999 sent during fiscal year 1999-2000. The survey of two-year-old children reflects immunization levels statewide and by 12 selected counties: Broward, Dade, Duval, Escambia, Hillsborough, Lee, Leon, Orange, Palm Beach, Pinellas, Polk, and Volusia.

Please note the line drawn through each ranking on the attached sheets. Those counties above the line have reached the state goal for that assessment, and those listed below the line failed to reach the established goal. We hope you will find this a convenient and useful tool in evaluating your immunization activities.
